In order to accomplish the political mandates, the Chinese government established *the ASEAN-China Center* in 2011 with an aim to facilitate ASEAN-China cooperation in trade, investment, tourism, education and culture. In 2013, the P.R. China proposed to establish *the Network of ASEAN-China Think-Tanks* to provide stronger intellectual support for the deepening of the strategic partnership. While the first organization presents its view on economics and culture, the later entity will focus on the academic sphere.
